## Making the most of A LARGE SPACE

GRAHAM BARNARD, OWNER OF MATRIX KITCHENS HAS THIS ADVICE...

- Designing a large room requires more thought as it usually offers much more freedom to express. Before you think of furniture, think of the room itself. Think carefully about natural light sources and whether these need to be complemented or enhanced. Map out the entrances and understand the flow in and out of the spaces which are the main traffic sources.
- Consider how and if you wish to divide the space up for cooking, dining, maybe an area for a sofa, a snug or breakfast bar.
  Often, large kitchens are open plan and they become places to relax and entertain so the space has to be calculated, prioritised and multifunctional. An island is often the preferred way of starting to divide up the space but it is not the only way. Rugs, roof lanterns, skylights and ceiling coffers can all do this but much depends on the style you wish to create and ceiling heights.
- I always put a great priority on the entrance into the space and your first glimpse of the room. That first impression is so important. Try not to have too much clutter and obstacles in the way of the main entrance. Keep these virtual corridors within the room as free and open as possible and the space will feel larger and welcoming. Decide If your furniture style requires an eye-catching feature and make sure this is prominent on entrance.
