Designer kitchen

SOPHISTICATED WOODEN CABINETRY AND LUXURIOUS BRASS DETAIL CREATE A HEAD-TURNING KITCHEN IN THIS NORTH LONDON HOME






ith a view to creating a kitchen that was different to anything they had seen before, the owners of this North London home approached designer Richard McGee of McCarron & Co. 'The owners wanted us to design a unique kitchen that felt opulent and timeless,' says Richard, 'but also one that was practical for their family and ideal for entertaining.' McCarron & Co were commissioned very early on in the renovation project, working alongside the interior and lighting designer. The space now has three sections with a full-height oversized pocket door dividing the main kitchen to the living room and bar area. The cabinetry materials used in the bar area, which has a working sink, fridge and wine cooler included, were chosen to add balance to the open-plan space.

Storage was a key consideration. 'For the best solution, we stole space from the adjacent prep kitchen and used it to house a bank of tall units with Gaggenau ovens,' explains Richard. 'This then left enough space on the back wall for a breakfast cabinet with pocket doors.' For the cabinets, a bespoke Albemarle design was chosen, which features ash doors painted in Farrow & Ball Elephant's Breath, and walnut doors and panels stained to match furniture used throughout the property. Taj Mahal natural quartzite worktops and splashback complement the design. 'The worktop contains all the colours of the materials used in the kitchen, which adds to the overall harmony,' says Richard. 'To create the handleless look and add luxury, the kitchen also includes brass inlay – a detail followed through into the bespoke side panels on the island and tall cabinets. It's a striking colour and against the walnut it looks great.' EKBB

WHICH AREA DO YOU THINK PARTICULARLY WORKS WELL IN THIS KITCHEN? The pocket door coffee and breakfast station is

wery eye-catching. We were able to make room for this space by playing around with the layout at a very early stage. To free up the space on the back wall for the pocket door we decided to house the Gaggenau ovens in a tall bank of units to one side of the kitchen, with a fridge and freezer on the opposite side of the room. The breakfast station now houses a coffee machine and microwave and provides space for the owners to prepare a hot drink or snack. It's a stunning design feature and allows the kitchen design to flow freely when closed and, once opened, it works as a very practical resource for hiding useful kitchenalia neatly out of sight.

HOW HAS LIGHTING BEEN USED HERE TO ENHANCE THE KITCHEN?

We worked in collaboration with a lighting designer to choose solutions that would subtly enhance the cabinetry and brass details, and also be practical. We suggested the warm white LED strips integrated within the furniture and concealed from view, which shines onto the working surfaces. The lighting designer then enhanced this adding practical spot lighting as well as statement pendant lights above the sofa and dining area.

WHAT IS YOUR TOP TIP FOR CREATING A STYLISH YET WELCOMING KITCHEN? Firstly, think about how you are going to move around and use your kitchen and consider dedicated storage for all appliances and items. Once this has been confirmed, you can move onto the finishes which help the cabinetry fit comfortably and effortlessly into its surroundings. My top tip for anyone about to embark on a similar project is to approach your kitchen designer as early in the process as possible. Moving a stud wall slightly and stealing space from less important rooms

could help achieve your dream kitchen, for example.
